

Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord'; and she told them that he had said these things to her." John 20:18

Mary Magdalene was one of the witnesses to the crucifixion. She would have witnessed firsthand Jesus' final words and his final breath. We also know that Mary Magdalene was one of the women who went to the tomb early on the morning of the third day. She had gone with the others to do the final preparations on Jesus body in the tomb. They had brought along with them oils and spices, so we know that they were expecting to find a body.

But Mary carried with her other things besides the oil and the spices. She carried with her the grief of losing Jesus. Anyone who has lost someone understands the

weight of grief. The weight of grief makes it so a person can hardly function. The weight of grief makes a person want to be near to the one they've lost. The weight of grief makes a person want to do something in the face of death. Mary arrives at the tomb that morning weighed down by the grief she carried. A grief that demanded she do something to stay connected to Jesus, even in his death. She is the example of how to keep moving forward in the face of trauma and grief and not give up before we see the miracle.

"I have seen the Lord!"

These words of Mary Magdelene, the apostle to the apostles, the woman chosen by Jesus to be the first to know of his resurrection, are really the first words of Easter.

"I have seen the Lord!"

So often, it seems, we leave this "seeing" to something that happened over two thousand years ago. But the truth of Easter, the joy that is ours, is that it is something happening now. And the question each of us must ask is – where have I encountered Christ?

During Holy Week we will walk together through the anguish of Gethsemane, to the darkness of the shadow of the cross, but we will end our journey rejoicing in the empty tomb. The message of that moment is that Christ is alive – here and now.

Where is he? He is in the marginalized, the homeless, the oppressed. He is in you, and me, and everyone. He is also present with us when we gather around the Communion table.

Easter is a powerful statement – that no darkness or death is more powerful than the light of God. But it is also a call to action for all of us. It is a call to model Christ in the world in the ways he showed us before his death – to love and to serve as he did for us.

We are Easter people!

We are also the body of Christ that is alive in the world then, now and always.

A people ready to proclaim the good news – and then to live into that good news by serving the least of these.

The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Flowering the Cross

Throughout Lent, the bear wooden cross has been moved forward on the altar to become our focus for Lent. The cross is our focus because that is where our Messiah suffered and died in our place. It is here that Jesus shed his blood and purchased our freedom from sin.

But the cross also symbolizes God's love for us. So how do we transform the cross from an object of torture and death to a thing of love and life? In the spirit of Christian celebration, on Easter morning we will observe the centuries old custom of the "flowering of the cross." You will be invited to come forward to the cross during the prelude, with cut flowers you bring from home or flowers that will be provided, and place your flowers on the cross. In this way we will dramatically symbolize Christ's triumph over death, his resurrection, and his gift of everlasting life.

After worship, the cross will be moved outside, to the top of the steps, so that we can share this great news with all who pass our church.




Join us on April 4th at 7:00pm for Church Movie Night where we'll be viewing Chocolat....

Proposal for the Restructuring of the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic

As most of you know the RCA is undergoing a significant restructuring to enhance effectiveness, strengthen connections, and streamline its' governance. In response to denomination wide restructuring, it has been proposed to move from a four tiered structure composed of the Consistory, a newly formed Middle Assembly, and the Synod.

A proposal has been drafted to take our current Regional Synod (which consists of five Classis: City, Delaware-Raritan, Greater Palisades, Passaic Valley, and New Brunswick) and form each of these into its own Middle Assembly. With these Middle Assemblies assuming the responsibilities of both the Classis and Regional Synod. These responsibili-

ties include:

Ecclesiastical Oversight: Examination and ordination of misters, supervision of churches, and pastoral care for clergy. **Judicial Functions:** Establishing and overseeing a judicial body within each Middle Assembly to handle discipline and disputes in accordance with the Book of Church Order.

Congregational Support: Providing guidance on church health, revitalization, and mission strategies.

Administrative Duties: Managing records, overseeing church properties, and facilitating orderly governance.

Representation to the Synod: Ensuring each Middle Assembly maintains a voice in the broader denomination. In addition, it has been proposed that a new entity known as the Mid-Atlantic Network be established. This network of churches will serve as a hub for joint ventures and ministry resourcing among the five Middle Assemblies creating synergy for innovation in worship, outreach and discipleship, shared mission and ministry development, stewardship resources, technology support, and specialized ministries.

If approved these measures would go into effect beginning in July of 2025 with all legal restructuring and network formation in place by June of 2027. Any asset transfers will be completed by June of 2028. If you have any questions, please reach out to Pastor Ed.
